During Today's Worship

- **Large-print bulletins and hearing enhancement equipment are available** for ease of worship. An usher will be happy to assist you. At the close of worship, please return the unit to the sound booth at the rear of the sanctuary.



"I've Been Wondering..." FAQs about Worship

Why are we asked to fill out an estimate-of-giving card and turn it in during worship?

There are really two questions here. First, filling out an estimate-of-giving card asks us to be intentional about how we plan to support financially our ministry together as the church in the coming year. When we can name our commitment—our hopes and intentions—we are better able to follow through on what we want to see happen. Completing an estimate-of-giving card also helps the Session to plan most effectively for the coming year. When we know the total of what our members and friends plan to contribute financially, the Session can then better allocate our resources to maximize our efforts. In other words, we can know what we can do when we know what resources, financial and otherwise, we might expect to receive. Also, we call it an "estimate-of-giving", because it is just that. Circumstances may change during the year that require you to adjust your estimate one way or the other. Your estimate-of-giving is not a binding contract, but simply a statement of your intentions and plans. If it needs to change, you may notify our Office Manager.

Second, filling out an estimate-of-giving card and turning it in during worship points to the whole of our giving as a spiritual discipline. We do this as an act of worship to remind ourselves that we are not merely "fundraising." Rather, we are responding to the abundant blessings of God with our lives, not only our time and our talents but our treasure, as well. Jesus tells us, "where your treasure is, there you heart will be also." (Matthew 6:21) This suggests that we should give to those things to which we want to grow closer. As we give, we grow.

What if I feel moved to receive Communion, but am not baptized?

The Lord's Supper and Baptism are inseparable. If you feel called by the Holy Spirit to meet Christ in Communion, we believe that you are also being called to Baptism. We will not turn anyone away from the Lord's Table, but we do invite you to speak to the pastor or a member of the session about Baptism as soon as possible.

In the details...

The banner to the left of the chancel represents the liturgical season known as Ordinary Time. "Ordinary" is not to connote "mundane," but refers rather to the counting of the days using ordinal numbers (first, second, third, etc.). The whole of the church year can be understood to be an annual rehearsal of the history of salvation as seen in the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ to new life. Ordinary Time consists of those days outside of the major festival seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. This is the time when scriptures about Jesus' life and ministry are read in worship, when our life in the church is marked by spiritual growth, which gives reason for the color of ordinary time (green for growth).

In the banner, the Alpha (A) and Omega (Ω) are the first and last letters, respectively, of the Greek alphabet (the original language of the New Testament). Taken together, they represent God's sacred time which spans between the beginning of time at creation and the ending of time at the consummation of all that is. Jesus said, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end" (Revelation 22:13). Chronos, secular, human time is designated by the sundial.

MUSIC NOTES

Frances Ridley Havergal (1836-1879) wrote the classic hymn of Christian commitment, *Take My Life*. Her spiritual journey began early in her life. She began to memorize Bible passages at age four and wrote poetry by the age of seven. Havergal learned Hebrew, Greek, and several modern languages. She was an accomplished pianist and singer. (-C.
