

"I've Been Wondering..." FAQs about Worship

What is a cantor?

Strictly speaking, a cantor is a leader of song. In the Jewish synagogue, as well as in the Christian church throughout the ages, the office of cantor is a specialized ministry that serves by leading the congregation in its worship. Whereas a soloist may sing as a part of worship, a cantor more specifically leads the congregation in prayer through song. For instance, the psalms are really prayers set to music. They come to us from the Jewish tradition and the Hebrews' experience of God in the Old Testament. In worship, the psalms serve not as a distinct scripture reading, but as a prayerful response to the first reading. We pray the psalms in a variety of ways. Sometimes the congregation sings the psalm as a metrical (hymn) setting. At other times, we sing it as a responsorial setting where the cantor sings the verses and the congregation sings the refrain. Regardless, the psalms are prayers we sing and the cantor serves to lead the congregation's singing in a more relational and directive role than simply a "soloist." A cantor's role is not limited to leading the psalms. The cantor also leads the congregation's other musical prayers, regardless of whether the congregation is also singing along.

Why do we have times of silence in the liturgy?

We live in a world saturated with noise and our culture bombards us with sounds all around. Cell phones and computers, television and radio constantly vie for our attention. In the midst of life in this sort of world, the church gathers to *hear* God's voice in song, scripture, sermon and prayer, but also to *listen* for the Holy Spirit and respond from the depths of our hearts. Silence is the space within the liturgy for this to happen. Aidan Kavanagh has said that silence in worship is "the thunderous quiet of people communicating that which escapes being put into mere words." In our worship, silence is observed at the time of confession, following the sermon, during the prayers of the people, and elsewhere depending upon the season. Learning to engage silence requires just that—discipline and effort, but we are blessed if we try because this silence can become a fruitful oasis by which we are nourished in communion with God. Consider these scriptures: "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10); "The Lord is in his holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before him!" (Habakkuk 2:20).

What if I feel moved to receive Communion, but am not baptized?

The Lord's Supper and Baptism are inseparable. If you feel called by the Holy Spirit to meet Christ in Communion, we believe that you are also being called to Baptism. We will not turn anyone away from the Lord's Table, but we do invite you to speak to the pastor or a member of the session about Baptism as soon as possible.

FREE LUNCHEON & PRESENTATION

The Peacemaking Offering is one of four denominational offerings. It supports the peacemaking efforts of the church at every governing body level and provides an opportunity to witness to God's gift of peace in the world. Gifts given to the Peacemaking Offering through a congregation are divided in the following manner: 25% retained by congregations for support of their own peacemaking ministry, 25 percent used to support presbytery and synod peacemaking efforts, and 50 percent forwarded to the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program of the Presbyterian Mission Agency so that it can continue to provide assistance and resources for congregations and other bodies of the PCUSA.

This year, the 25% of the offering that remains locally will go to The Covering House. The Covering House (thecoveringhouse.org) is an organization of client support for women who are 20 years old or younger. They provide residential treatment for young women who have been enslaved in human trafficking and have been able to break free of this horrible abuse. Plan to come listen to Kathy Farrar who will explain the burgeoning growth of human trafficking in the St. Louis area, what life was like for these young women and how The Covering House is making a difference in their lives. (NOTE: This presentation is not suitable for pre-teen children, and you may wish to have a serious discussion about human trafficking with your teenager before attending. If your pre-teen children will attend the luncheon, we can provide childcare in another room if so requested on the reservation form.)

You are invited to a free luncheon during peacemaking season. The MME and the Fellowship Committees, along with Presbyterian Women, are sponsoring a Peacemaking Luncheon and a speaker from The Covering House on Sunday, October 12th right after the second worship service. Please plan to attend this luncheon (a free will offering will be taken and given to The Covering House).
